



## Sandy Ridge - Heritage

A cultural heritage assessment has been undertaken to assess the potential impacts on Aboriginal and European heritage. The assessment focused on impacts during construction and operation of the proposed Sandy Ridge Facility. The cultural heritage assessment was undertaken by a qualified, local anthropologist/archaeologist. The cultural heritage investigation included:

- A desktop review of previous heritage surveys and relevant heritage databases to determine whether there were any listed heritage sites within or in close proximity of the proposed development envelope.
- A field survey in consultation with representatives of the Kapam Native Title Group, Kelamaia Kabu(d)n and Widji Group.

Database searches found no known records of heritage items (European or Aboriginal) within the proposed development envelope. In addition, the cultural heritage site survey did not record any evidence of Aboriginal or European heritage sites (registered or previously unrecorded) within the proposed development envelope. There are no current registered native title claimants and no determined native title holders.

The Aboriginal representatives from the Kaparn Native Group, Kelamaia Kabu(d)n and Widji Group (who assisted in the cultural heritage survey) confirmed there are no cultural heritage site related to the Sandy Ridge Proposal.

Based on the above information, there would be

no impact on Aboriginal or European cultural heritage sites or on cultural associations within the proposed development envelope during construction or operation of the proposed Sandy Ridge Facility.
